Half-a-century story started as friendly joke

Lawrence O. "Larry" Brown has been serving the U.S. government for the last 50 years, and he is not ready to stop yet.

Though he hadn't planned for it at all, Larry enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1965 and retired from active duty in 1987 at SHAPE.

"It all started with seven friends playing basketball," Larry said. "Somebody said, 'Let's go down and mess with the recruiters.' Eight of us went down there, two of us stayed, and I am moving along ever since."

Fifty years later, he still has a big smile on his face when he tells how much he loves to be a work leader at U.S. Army Garrison Benelux-Brussels Army Post Office.

After serving the government for half a century, some might legitimately think he is ready to retire, but, after all those years, his commitment and motivation remain unchanged.

and I am still going to do it as long as I can," he said.
"If you love what you're doing, if you enjoy what you're
doing and if you are with great people, it makes the job
easier and fine," he said. "And, until that changes, I will still
be doing what I do."

Larry is known and respected among his peers for the quality of his work.

"Larry is very inspiring because he is a man of integrity," said Joshua Alo, postmaster at USAG Benelux-Brussels Army Post Office. "When I need something to be done, I ask him and I know it will be finished, and it will be done the way it is supposed to be done. He is like my right-hand man."

Larry is appreciated not only for his hard work but for his human values, too.

"He is very thoughtful," Alo said. "He'll always be there for you. If he notices that something is wrong, he'll come and ask you."

Larry is more than a co-worker, he is a team member who cares for his teammates.

"He remembers little things like when it is your birthday," Alo said. "Sometimes he will bring in a plate of food just for no reason; he's that kind of guy."

In fifty years, Larry traveled the world, went through a lot of assignments and met a lot of people along the road, but he wouldn't change a single moment.

"I had a wonderful fifty years, and I wouldn't change anything," he said. "There were some ups and downs as usual in life, but the good outweighs the bad. Whatever your life path is, you have to take it, and you should have no regret. Don't look back; look forward."

SACEUR changes command at SHAPE

NATO's 18th Supreme Allied Commander Europe (SACEUR), Gen. Curtis M. Scaparrotti, assumed command of Allied Command Operations (ACO) from Air Force Gen. Philip M. Breedlove at Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe May 4, according to a news release from the SHAPE Public Affairs Office.

Military members and civilians from across the 28 nations attended the ceremony, highlighting the continuing unity and solidarity of the military alliance at SHAPE, which celebrated its 65th anniversary in April.

In his farewell remarks, Breedlove said it had been a privilege to serve the Alliance and stressed the importance of NATO's role in today's global landscape.

"I really am very proud of all that you have done, and you should not underestimate your achievements," Breedlove said. "NATO has gone through a fundamental adjustment ... and the work that has gone into achieving that has been really significant."

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg presided over the change of command. During his remarks, Stoltenberg thanked Breedlove for his service. "Throughout these difficult times, your vision and your leadership have helped to make us more resilient, increased our level of readiness, strengthened our deterrence and enhanced our partnerships."

Stoltenberg also welcomed Scaparrotti and stressed that the change comes at a critical time, both for NATO and for Europe.

"In the months and years ahead, you will command forces from across our great Alliance and lead a remarkable team at SHAPE," Stoltenberg said, adding, "I know that you will do so with the same dedication, intelligence and professionalism you have shown throughout your impressive career."

Having served as the commander of United Nations Command, Combined Forces Command and U.S. Forces Korea, Scaparrotti said he believes relationships are the cornerstone of the Alliance.

"I look forward to maintaining the excellent relationship that this command has nurtured for many decades and will continue to personally invest in relationships that will enable our Alliance to endure any challenge," Scaparrotti said.

"Today's challenges have evolved and significantly differ from those of the past," he said. "Our alliance will need to counter hybrid threats, which can act with little or no warning, and also manifest themselves here at home."

One of NATO's two strategic commander posts, the position of SACEUR is the head of Allied Command Operations, the command responsible for the planning and execution of combined, joint, effects-based military operations in order to meet Alliance objectives.

Established in 1951 with Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower as the first SACEUR, the prestigious post is traditionally held by an American officer.

During his speech, Scaparrotti said he was grateful for the opportunity to serve in this unique role.

"As our Alliance shares a long history formed on mutual commitment to stability and prosperity, it is the greatest honor and privilege to assume command built on such a great legacy," Scaparrotti said.

Highlights of the ceremony included a flyover of four F-16s from the Belgian air force in honor of Breedlove, who is also an F-16 pilot.

At the end of the ceremony, eight paratroopers from Allied nations, including the vice chief of staff, French Lt. Gen. Michel Yakovleff, landed on the parade field. Each paratrooper carried a flag representing a different aspect of NATO: the host nation of Belgium; NATO; ACO; Allied Command Transformation (ACT); France (in honor of French Gen. Denis Mercier, Supreme Allied Commander Transformation); the European Union; NATO Special Operations Headquarters; and the United States of America (in honor of Breedlove and Scaparrotti).

Scaparrotti assumed command of U.S. European Command (EUCOM) during a similar ceremony Tuesday in Stuttgart, Germany. SACEUR jointly holds the title of EUCOM commander as a way to achieve interoperability in the aim of strengthening NATO's collective defense.

A ceremony that includes a wreath-laying will be held at the War Victims monument next to the church in the

village of Wereth, Belgium, May 21 at 11 a.m. to honor the memory of the Wereth 11, who had been the lastsurviving Soldiers of the 333rd Field Artillery Battalion.

Taken prisoner by the SS, these African-American Soldiers were tortured and murdered during World War II's Battle of the Bulge. The Wereth Massacre occurred the same day as the Malmedy Massacre.

The ceremony and memorial were created by the

Langer family, who invited the freezing Soldiers into their home at great risk and never forgot the men who ate their last meal in the family's kitchen.

The ceremony is open to all and will include performances by the Vogelweh Gospel Choir and a bugler from Bugles Across America as well as presentations by Belgian and American VIPs and Belgian students.

SHAPE Cinema, Pizza Bowl making big changes

The hottest ticket on SHAPE may be the "Captain America" event tonight, but that's not the only action at SHAPE Cinema and the Pizza Bowl.

They've combined forces to become the Family Fun Center, and the new director of operations has already made changes that make both facilities even better for patrons. Phil Brewington said he has almost 30 years in the bowling business, working his way up from pin-chaser. He was most recently the operations manager at Ramstein Bowling Center's Bicentennial Lanes on Ramstein Air Base.

Even before his first official day of work late last fall, Brewington offered his ideas, some of which were implemented before his first day of work.

"They wanted me to take a look at the Bowling Center. I talked to Maj. David Leahy, the director of operations for MWB (Morale and Welfare Branch at SHAPE)," Brewington said. "That way, I could hit the ground running" when he started the job officially.

He said he's trying to give patrons the stateside experience at the Family Fun Center.

In the Pizza Bowl, several walls have been torn down to open up the space, some new furniture has been added, and the party room has been reduced in size and converted into office space. (The pre-existing office space was far removed from the dining rooms and the lanes.)

SHAPE Cinema, also called the SHAPE Alliance Auditorium because it's open for community events Mondays and Tuesdays, has undergone major upgrades. The concession stand at the right side

of the lobby has been torn down, and a new self-service refreshment stand with only a cashier has replaced it.

"MWB and FMWR (Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation at USAG Benelux) have given me a lot of support to help get this stuff done," he said. "Due to Customs cooperation, we're getting our movies more steadily now. You can start looking for a longer time span for (movie) schedules."

Further upgrades coming

The Pizza Bowl menu is being upgraded regularly (including Cowboy Burgers), and all but one Bicky menu item (students' favorite, the Bicky Royal) is being eliminated. Burger patties from the Defense Commissary Agency will be the order of the day when the other burgers sell out. Brewington is also coordinating with an American

vendor so American products will be delivered to him so he won't have to make the trip to DeCa's commissary on Chièvres Air Base.

In the next week or so, Brewington will be getting even newer furniture for the Pizza Bowl from the bowling center in Ansbach, Germany, which is part of the Pentagon's European Drawdown Plan. In addition to new furniture in the dining areas, tables will be moved down into the pit area so patrons will be able to enjoy food while watching their teammates bowl.

Brewington plans to turn the courtyard between the SHAPE Cinema and the Pizza Bowl into a biergarten.

SHAPE Cinema seating will soon have mounted cup holders and click-in portable trays, based on the football-stadium model. Once that's done, Brewington will bring

in nachos and hotdogs.

This summer, the movie theater will host "Monster Movie Madness" showing old classics like "The Creature From the Black Lagoon" -- what used to be termed "popcorn movies." SHAPE Cinema will play older and newer versions of monster-themed movies back to back, such as playing 1955's "Tarantula" then 2002's "Eight-Legged Freaks."

Just around the corner

"We've got a secret weapon in the works for the Pizza Bowl," Brewington said, smiling. "We've already got the funding approved for it. I think it will improve the community."

Travel the Benelux

Maastricht is one of the oldest cities in the Netherlands

Located in the southeast of the Netherlands, within a walking distance from Belgium, Maastricht is the capital of the Dutch province Limburg. Soon enough, the city of 120,000 inhabitants stood out thanks to its cultural diversity and was therefore chosen to be the birthplace of the European Union where the Maastricht Treaty was signed in 1992.

The city of Maastricht is split in two by the river Meuse hence its name which means "crossing at the Meuse". The commercial activities are mainly located on the western bank of the river whereas the station and the Bonnefantenmuseum are located on the eastern bank.

The Bonnefantenmuseum, museum of fine art, is probably the most famous museum in the city. It dates back to 1884 and can boast a broad variety of art. Indeed, this combination of old art and contemporary art under the same roof makes it unique in its way.

The city in itself is also worth a visit as it can boast 1,677 national heritage sites, more than any Dutch city outside Amsterdam. The whole city center is even a protected cityscape. Wandering through the city, you will have the opportunity to see remnants of the city fortifications, Sint Servaasbrug, which is the oldest bridge in the Netherlands but also so many beautiful

parks and promenades along the river "Meuse."

If you are not in the mood to visit, Maastricht has a lot to offer in terms of shopping. As a matter of fact, in addition to the small boutiques and the modern shopping centers, markets are organized on a regular basis.

Each Wednesday and Friday, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., Maastricht hosts a market on "Market Square" during which you can find almost everything: plants, cosmetics, clothes, food, fresh produce. However, Wednesday's market is majorly famous for cloth and fabrics. On the other hand, Friday's market offers a broad variety of fish.

If you are keen on antique furniture, make sure you go to the flea market, which takes place every Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Stationstraat. This is considered as a real cross between an antique market and a curio shop.

No matter if you are a shopaholic or a history buff, Maastricht can please each and everyone of us.

Why is the Belgian flag black, yellow and red?

Flags have the power to convey history, a sense of belonging to a country and to common values. They are symbols of union, freedom, speech and victory.

The black, yellow and red colors of the national Belgian flag date back to the 18th century and were used for the first time during the revolt against the Austro-Hungarian domination. Belgium was then under Dutch control. At that time, the bands were horizontal and remained so until 1830.

In 1830, Belgium gained independence from the Netherlands. When the country was liberated from the Dutch influence, Belgians wanted to make a clear distinction between the Dutch flag and the Belgian one to avoid any confusion. The bands of the Belgian flag became vertical, modeled after the French tricolor flag.

When the Belgian constitution adopted the red, yellow and black colors for its flag, it also adopted the Lion of Belgium with the motto: "L'Union fait la Force" (Union is Strength) for its coat of arms.

The Belgian flag displays three equal vertical stripes: black stands for strength, yellow for wisdom and red for bravery. The colors of the national flag were taken from the flag of Brabant, a province in what was called the Low Countries. This flag represented a golden lion on a black surface with a red tongue and nails. The flag was carried during the revolt as an important symbol of independence. The three colors are symbolic of the Kingdom of Belgium's coat of arms. In October 1831, the Constitution adopted the black color at the hoist side.
